


Overall Impression How would you rate the overall quality of the portfolio? ² responses




Typography How would you rate the students' overall proficiency in typography? ² responses




Design Principles To what extent did the students apply fundamental design principles in their visual solutions?




Technical Skills How would you rate the students' technical skills in executing their designs? ² responses




Design Concept How would you rate how well the students demonstrated a clear design concept in their projects?




Creativity How would you rate the overall creativity demonstrated in the visual solutions presented in the portfolio? 2 responses




Problem-Solving Skills To what extent did the students effectively address design challenges in their projects?




Project Variety How well did the portfolio showcase a good variety of projects and design styles? ² responses
